

Living Along a Kentucky Stream **SUCCESS STORY EXAMPLE**

Over 90,000 miles of rivers and streams are found in Kentucky. These miles of stream touch Kentuckians every day. Streams provide flood control, wildlife habitat, recreation, and most importantly, a source of water that is used in thousands of ways. But, the quality of a stream is only as good as the land that surrounds and drains into it. That is why it is important to practice good stream stewardship. _____ (Name of County) County presented *Living Along a Kentucky Stream* program to (#) participants.
